## WHAT DOES CAPAHA BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

### Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

### What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and Transaction or Loss History
- Account Balances and Payment History
- Credit History and Overdraft History

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

### How?

All financial companies need to share **customers'** personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their **customers'** personal information; the reasons **Capaha Bank** chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

## What we do

### How does Capaha Bank protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

We restrict access by user controls, as well as physical, electronic and procedural safeguards that comply with federal standards.

### How does Capaha Bank collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- Open an account or apply for a loan
- Give us contact information or show us personal identification
- Provide employment or income information

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

### Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See "Other Important Information" below.

## Definitions

### Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *TammCorp, Inc.*

### Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Nonaffiliates with whom we share can include mortgage companies, insurance companies, collection agencies, credit bureaus and product service providers.*

### Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *Capaha Bank does not jointly market.*

## Other important information

For Our Illinois Customers: Illinois law requires that you opt-in to information sharing. Therefore, before we would share your information with a third party, except where permitted by law, we will obtain your permission.
